





Global Hand Wash Day Celebration

Global Hand washing Day (GHD) is an international hand washing promotion campaign to motivate and mobilize people around the world to improve their hand washing habits. Washing hands at critical points both during the day and washing with soap are important. In 2008, Global Hand Washing Day was celebrated for the first time. This day aims to make people around the world aware of the importance of washing their hands with soap in order to prevent diseases and infections.





Global Hand washing Day occurs on 15 October of every year. The global campaign is dedicated to raising awareness of hand-washing with soap as a key factor to disease prevention. With proper Hand Washing, respiratory and intestinal diseases can be reduced by 25–50%. In our school students played a dram related to awareness of it on 16 October.



Fire Safety Mock Drill – A Life Saving Exercise

In continuation with the exercise to create awareness among the students about disaster management, a mock fire and evacuation drill involving students and teachers was conducted from classes VI to XI on 18th October 2024 to create awareness among the students about fire-fighting techniques and the ways to respond swiftly in times of such emergency situation.

The mock drill was carried out in the school to prepare students and teachers for any such eventuality under the fire risk reduction programme. The purpose to organize the mock drill was to check the readiness of the school to face any such fire emergency and also to make the students and staff aware about the Fire Fighting Rescue Operation.

A group of teachers and student volunteers armed with necessary paraphernalia required for fire fighting and rescue operations positioned themselves at vantage points to guide and assist the students in the mock fire and evacuation drill. The students were escorted by their subject teachers to the school ground after the hooter sound. Once all had assembled on the ground, they were advised not to panic in case of any disaster. They were instructed to be with teachers at the time of disaster and follow the instructions given to them by their teachers.



Diyas symbolise goodness and purity, and lighting them denotes dispelling darkness and going into light.

And since Deepavali is celebrated on the new moon day, a time of darkness everywhere; light these lamps are a means to get rid of darkness.





When a *Diya* is *lit*, it is removing the negative energies that could be present in a space and bring in positivity.

The Hindu community believes that lighting diyas on Diwali keeps the family is protected from untimely death, brings luck and enlists Lakshmi's blessings for wealth, prosperity and success



Inter House Toran Making Competition Grade 3 to 5



Toran are hung across doorways as a symbol of welcome and prosperity. These decorative pieces are usually made with vibrant marigold flowers, auspicious mango leaves, and delicate bells.



Torans are used to decorate the main entrance of the home. The main idea behind decorating the homes is to please and attract the goddess of wealth, Lakshmi. These torans are the first thing that welcome guests.

Inter House Toran Making Competition Grade 3 to 5



Toran meaning gateway in Sanskrit, is a garland-like decorative, made out of mango-tree leaves and marigold flowers. It is used to adorn the doors of homes in all major Hindu festivals.



Toran connecting with tradition and culture, while also infusing the festival with color and beauty.

Inter House Rangoli Making Competition Grade 6 to 11



The rangoli represents the happiness, positivity and liveliness of a household, and is intended to welcome Lakshmi, the goddess of wealth and good luck.



It is believed that a Hindu household without a clean entrance and rangoli is an abode of daridra (bad luck). The purpose of rangoli is beyond decoration.

Inter House Rangoli Making Competition Grade 6 to 11



The purpose of rangoli is beyond decoration. Traditionally either powdered calcite and limestone or cereal powders are used for the basic design





Rangoli have different names based on the state and culture. Rangoli hold a significant role in the everyday life of a Hindu household especially historically when the flooring of houses were untiled.

An Inspirational Biography



Shri Sardar Vallabhbhai Patelji (31st October, 1875 – 15th December, 1950)

Vallabhbhai Jhaverbhai Patel was born in Nadiad, Gujarat on 31 October, 1875. He was popularly known as Sardar Patel. He was a senior leader of the Indian National Congress who played a leading role in the country's struggle for independence. He acted as Home Minister during the political integration of India and the Indo-Pakistani War of 1947. He also served as the first Deputy Prime Minister of India.

There had been an instance when he treated a painful boil without any hesitation using a hot iron rod. At the age of 22, when everyone completes their graduation, Sardar Patel completed his matriculation and due to this everyone thought that he would be doing ordinary jobs.

He was a successful lawyer. He subsequently organized peasants from Kheda, Borsad, and Bardoli in Gujarat in non-violent civil disobedience against the British Raj. Under the chairmanship of Sardar Patel, "Fundamental Rights and Economic Policy" resolution was passed by the Congress in 1931.

Sardar Patel was intensely loyal to Gandhiji and organized relief efforts for refugees fleeing to Punjab and Delhi from Pakistan and worked to restore peace. He led the task of forging a united India, successfully integrating into the newly independent nation those British colonial provinces that had been 'allocated' to India. It was Sardar Patel who persuaded almost every princely state to accede to India. His commitment to national integration in the newly independent country was total and uncompromising, earning him the sobriquet "Iron Man of India". He is also remembered as the "Patron saint of India's civil servants" for having established the modern all-India services system.

After suffering a massive heart attack (his second), Sardar Patel died on 15 December, 1950, at Birla House in Bombay. Sardar Patel is best remembered as the "Unifier of India". The Statue of Unity, the world's tallest statue, was dedicated to him on 31 October, 2018, which is approximately 182 m (597 ft) in height.
