

Life-Saving Skills: CPR Seminar

Date: 26-07-2025

Venue: Atmiya Vidyalay, Manjalpur, Vadodara

Speaker: Dr. Amit Patel

A Life-Changing Learning Experience

On July 26, 2025, Atmiya Vidyalaya Manjalpur had the privilege of hosting an enlightening seminar on Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR), conducted by the distinguished **Dr. Amit Patel**. This educational session proved to be not just informative but potentially life-saving for all attendees.

Meet Our Expert Speaker

Dr. Amit Patel brought an impressive 34 years of experience in the medical and training field to our school. As an expert in healthcare administration and occupational safety, he serves as an Executive Committee Member of the Indian Medical Association, Vadodara branch, and holds the prestigious position of President of the Vadodara branch of Indian Institution of Occupational Health. Currently associated with GSFC Limited, **Dr. Patel** is also recognized as a pioneer in adult vaccination in Gujarat.

Understanding the Crisis: Cardiac Arrest in India

The seminar began with sobering statistics that highlighted the urgency of CPR knowledge. **Dr. Patel** revealed that 15-20% of deaths in India are attributed to sudden cardiac arrest, affecting approximately 7 people per 1000 population annually. With India's population of 140 crores, this represents a major public health crisis that makes CPR training more relevant here than in developed countries.



What Causes Sudden Cardiac Arrest?

• **Dr. Patel** explained the primary causes affecting different age groups:

In Adults:

- Coronary Artery Disease (most common) blockages in heart's blood vessels leading to heart attacks
- Arrhythmia (irregular heart rhythm) particularly common in older people.

In Children and Young Adults:

- Cardiomyopathies (hereditary conditions)
- Inherited arrhythmia syndromes
- Non-cardiac conditions like respiratory arrest
- Drug-related complications

Other Causes:

• High-voltage electric shock, which immediately stops the heart

Prevention: The First Line of Defense

Before diving into emergency procedures, Dr. Patel emphasized the importance of prevention through lifestyle modifications:

Healthy Habits to Adopt:

- 40-45 minutes of daily exercise throughout life Healthy eating habits
- Stress management techniques
- Reduced mobile phone usage (except for educational purposes)

Risk Factors to Avoid:

- Smoking and alcohol consumption
- Obesity and lack of physical activity
- Excessive stress (a major factor in modern times) Uncontrolled blood pressure and diabetes

The Life-Saving Technique: CPR Understanding the Difference

Dr. Patel clarified the crucial difference between cardiac arrest and heart attack:

- Cardiac Arrest: Heart suddenly stops beating, patient becomes unconscious immediately with no blood circulation
- Heart Attack: Patient experiences nausea, vomiting, and restlessness but remains conscious



The Chain of Survival

The seminar highlighted four critical links in the chain of survival for out-of-hospital cardiac arrest:

- 1. Recognition of cardiac arrest condition
- 2. Call for help Activate Emergency Medical Services (108)
- 3. Early CPR The best remedy for cardiac arrest
- 4. Rapid defibrillation Using AED (Automated External Defibrillator)

The DRC-CAB Method: A Step-by-Step Guide

Dr. Patel introduced students to the systematic DRC-CAB approach:

D - Danger Assessment

Always ensure scene safety for rescuer, patient, and bystanders. This includes disconnecting electrical current before helping electric shock victims and using protective equipment when available.

R - Response Check

Assess patient responsiveness using three categories:

Alert: Patient is conscious and responsive

Semi-conscious: Can attempt to speak but unclear, responds to physical stimuli

Unconscious: Completely unresponsive (not necessarily dead)

C - Call for Help

Immediately call emergency services (108) and provide your identity, location, patient's age and gender, nature of emergency, and type of help needed.

C - Circulation (Pulse Check)

Check carotid pulse at the neck beside the trachea using three fingers in the groove next to Adam's apple. This is more reliable than radial pulse and should take maximum 10 seconds.

A - Airway Management

Unconscious patients lose muscle control, causing the tongue to fall back and block the airway. Use:

- Head Tilt-Chin Lift for normal situations
- Jaw Thrust when spinal injury is suspected

B - Breathing Assessment

Use the Look, Listen, Feel (LLF) method for maximum 10 seconds:

- Look: Watch for chest movement
- Listen: Place ear near patient's mouth/nose for breath sounds
- Feel: Sense air movement and chest rise



The Compression Technique

Proper Positioning

- Patient on hard, flat surface
- Rescuer kneeling beside patient's chest
- Elbows straight, arms perpendicular to chest

Hand Placement and Technique

- Locate imaginary line between nipples
- Find intersection with sternum (breastbone)
- Place heel of one hand, interlock fingers of other hand
- Rate: 100-120 compressions per minute
- Depth: 5 centimeters (2.5 inches)
- Allow complete chest recoil between compressions

The 30:2 Protocol

- 30 chest compressions followed by 2 rescue breaths
- Continue cycles until help arrives or patient responds

Critical Time Factors

Dr. Patel emphasized the urgency of immediate action:

- Brain damage begins after 4 minutes without oxygen
- Permanent brain damage occurs after 10 minutes
- Early CPR dramatically improves survival chances
- Effective compressions provide 25-33% of normal blood flow

When and How to Stop

Continue CPR until:

- Patient responds (pulse and breathing return)
- Emergency medical services arrive
- Rescuer becomes exhausted
- Scene becomes unsafe

If the patient recovers but remains unconscious, place them in the recovery position on their left side.

Community Impact and Future Steps

The seminar concluded with **Dr. Patel's** inspiring message about community preparedness. He emphasized that widespread CPR training can significantly reduce mortality rates from cardiac arrests. The session highlighted the need for:

- Regular hands-on training sessions
- Public access to AED devices
- Community awareness programs
- School and workplace emergency response training

Words of Wisdom

Dr. Patel shared his father's profound wisdom: "Whatever you earn in your young age and whatever exercise you do to build your body, that will last for your whole life." This statement perfectly encapsulated the seminar's message about the importance of both prevention and preparation.

Student Reflections

The seminar left a lasting impact on all attendees. Students expressed their gratitude for learning skills that could potentially save lives in their families and communities. Many committed to practicing the techniques regularly and spreading awareness among their peers.

Date: 30-07-2025

Atmiya Vidyalay organized a Robotics Workshop aimed at equipping students with practical knowledge and hands-on experience in robotics. The workshop was designed to bridge the gap between theoretical knowledge and real world applications, fostering innovation, problem-solving skills, and entrepreneurial thinking among participants. The event attracted a diverse std 6 to 8 students from various disciplines, eager to explore the rapidly evolving field of robotics and its potential for startups and technological advancements.



The workshop successfully achieved the following outcomes:

- **1. Understanding Basic Robotics Concepts:** Participants gained a foundational understanding of robotics, including the principles of design, sensors, actuators, and microcontrollers.
- **2. Hands-on Experience with Robotics Kits:** Students engaged in practical sessions using robotics kits to build simple robots, enhancing their technical skills and confidence in handling hardware components.
- **3. Development of Problem-Solving Skills:** The workshop encouraged participants to solve real world challenges by designing and programming robots to perform specific tasks, promoting critical thinking and creativity.

Ratan Naval Tata was born on December 28, 1937, into a prominent family of Indian industrialists. Raised by his grandmother, Lady Navajbai Tata, he was exposed to a focus on philanthropy and public service from a young age. He attended schools in Mumbai, then finished high school in New York City. He went on to study at Cornell University, earning a degree in architecture and structural engineering in 1962. He also later attended the Harvard Business School's Advanced Management Program in 1975.

In 1962, he began his career with the Tata Group, starting on the shop floor of Tata Steel. He held various positions within the group, gaining hands-on experience, and in 1991, he succeeded J. R. D. Tata as the chairman of Tata Sons, the parent company of the Tata Group.

During his tenure as chairman from 1991 to 2012, Ratan Tata transformed the Tata Group from a largely India-centric enterprise into a global business. He oversaw significant acquisitions, including the purchase of Tetley Tea, the truck-manufacturing operations of Daewoo Motors, and Jaguar Land Rover. Under his leadership, the group's revenues grew over 40 times and profits increased more than 50 times. He was known for his philanthropic activities and his leadership style, which emphasized ethics, integrity, and social responsibility. He was awarded the Padma Bhushan in 2000 and the Padma Vibhushan in 2008, two of India's highest civilian awards.
